MINUTES:

April meeting minutes are being approved via email.

CORRESPONDENCE:

1. Received a letter from Steve Tiska putting the Town on notice about potholes.
2. Received a FOIL request for records of the Dollar General. Linda will compile and send in after she gets them from Joe and Linnea.

FLOOR TIME:

1. There is a mess on the old Mott farm, Joe Reynolds said that if they have a \$10,000 Gross income they are considered a farm and there is nothing we can do about it. Jerri said someone called her about it, Jerri spoke to Annette from Ags & Markets asked her last fall about it and she said there was nothing they could do Jerri doesn't want to get involved because they are close to them and she don't want a hassle from them. Jerri feels it those types of farms that give farmers a bad name.

2. Karlene says the metal & scrap place is open. Betty says that scrap is not bringing anything at this time so people don't want to do cleanup right now.
3. Betty asked if we should cancel the Memorial Day Parade and it was decided that with the social distancing at this time we should cancel the parade to keep residents safe.
4. We will do the memorial for Mike on Labor Day Steve and Betty will work on getting a Blue Stone Plaque made for Mike's Memorial.
5. Jeri asked Chuck how things are going at the garage and Chuck says things are going fine, they just need to remember social distancing. Chuck has picked up wipes and sanitizers so they are in pretty good shape for PPE.
6. Jeri asked where you can get masks because she does not have one. Betty received 500 from the county and she will be at the Town Hall on Saturday from 10-12 to hand them out for residents.

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT REPORT:

APRIL

- Received letter from Steve Tiska on potholes on Pine Hill. There was nothing that we could do at that time with the limited staff and weather. Chuck has been there grading the holes and will finish them up. Jerri asked who is responsible if there is car damage and Chuck said that is why the letter was sent.
- Sweeping roads and changed the sweeper broom wafers.
- Stock piling stone deliveries.
- Installed driveway pipe on Thorpe Hill Rd.
- Plow frames off, summer tires on.
- Replaced a few Hydraulic lines on the backhoe, sent out leaking cylinders for rebuild.
- Picked up the part truck from the Town of Andes.
- Hauled sand.
- Prep old #4 to surplus. Chuck says they for 3,000-5,000
- Cleaned up tree on Pine Hill from 911 call.
- Received a check for \$140.00 for driveway pipe.
- Asking board for approval to surplus the old #4 - 1999 International.

Bill said he heard a rumor that the town was turning the burned truck from Andes back into a truck and does not feel that we should not be working on this if we are behind on other work.

Jerri heard a rumor that there was damage to the road on Randal Hill, Chuck says that it was nothing serious Ed Sherman couldn't pick up his back blade up because his hydraulic line broke and he said he would come back and rake the road off. One of the people complaining said that they sit at the turn around staring at the neighbors; Sherriff's department sent an officer out to talk to Chuck about what can be done about the turnaround, so there is no parking there.

- On the 20th Sentry Alarm was here all day to repair alarm system, needed new circuit panel.
